2	*Purchase and installation of outdoor gymnasium in Junior Playground	£10,354	Installation a huge success, with gymnasium used for all playtimes and lunchtimes and children more active. Also used as part of Wider Woodridge suite of activities.
3	Barnet School Sports Partnership (BPSS) membership. Provides a full programme of events to be used to increase participation	£1,300	The school took part in a wide range of competitions, tournaments and festivals - athletics, cross country, basketball, boccia, new age kurling, tag rugby, swimming gala, as well as girls and boys football tournaments.
4	New PE Curriculum Resource Pack – 'Get Set'	£550	Increase and teachers and sports coach confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and Games
5	PE Equipment Service and Repairs	£795	All major PE equipment in the hall and outside areas is checked for safety and any recommendations on repairs carried out. Benches and boxes repaired in hall. Adventure Trail outside repaired to ensure physical activity at playtimes.
